Chairman Royce Leads on National Security

Last year's brutal terrorist attack on San Bernardino brought home the threat of radical Islamist terrorism. Representative Royce visited the site of the attack and spoke with first responders about the aftermath. As Chairman of the House Foreign Affairs Committee, Representative Royce continues to press for a stronger U.S. response.

Defeating ISIS means denying terrorists a safe haven from which to plan attacks. With Representative Royce as Chairman, the House Foreign Affairs Committee has pressed the Administration to increase pressure on ISIS by using the United States' unique capabilities—like precise air support to Special Forces—to support those fighting ISIS on the ground.

Chairman Royce has also focused on stopping ISIS' use of the internet to recruit fighters. Hearings held by Chairman Royce have made it clear that the federal bureaucracy is ill-equipped for such a fast moving challenge. That's why Chairman Royce is advancing legislation to support those with the technical expertise and credible voice to take on ISIS online and remove their posts from social media before they inspire more devastating attacks.
